THE PROBLEM

Moyo, Uganda is a remote district in Northern Uganda. It's been over 15 years since the three-decade long Lord's Resistance Army insurgency. While many other districts are slowly rebuilding, Moyo District is still plagued with food insecurity, unemployment and trauma. The civil war in neighboring South Sudan has forced millions of South Sudanese to flee to surrounding countries. Moyo's refugee population nearly equals the local population. Due to the remote location and the transportation challenges to reach Moyo, most non-governmental organizations (NGOs) have chosen to work in other needy places in Uganda.

This under served region makes it a perfect opportunity for Pipeline Worldwide to leverage our experience and serve as the community catalyst. Through partners and sustainable solutions, we will significantly improve the quality of life for the people of Moyo, Uganda.

Despite the immense challenges in service and resource provision that has accompanied this refugee influx, Moyo embraces the refugees. Ugandans and South Sudanese have sought refuge in each other's countries for decades. North Ugandans know what it means to be refugees – and as a result, are welcoming the enormous flows arriving daily from South Sudan. Uganda has even been deemed the “*best place in the world*” to be a refugee.

To ensure effective service delivery through strategic planning, equitable resource allocation and reducing disparities to attain sustainable economic growth and development.

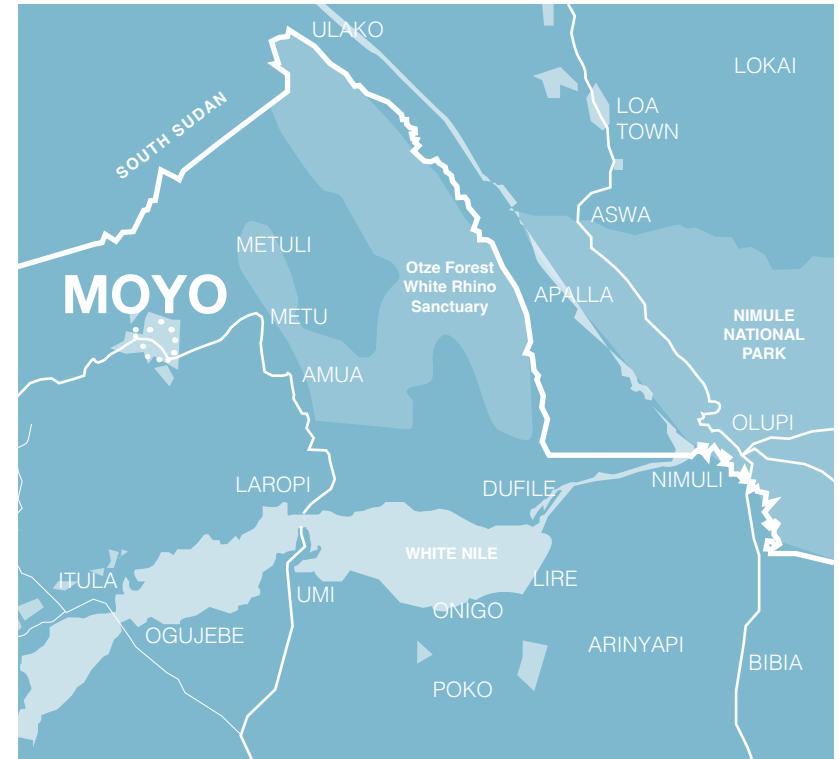


Moyo District is in the North Western Region of the Republic of Uganda, bordered by the Republic of South Sudan in the North, Yumbe District in the West, Adjumani District in the East and Arua in the Southwest.



LOCATION & ACCESS

It is very difficult to get to Moyo. The route from Gulu is mostly unpaved roads with a few narrow bridges to cross. You must take a ferry to cross the Nile River to reach Moyo. Moyo District covers 2,059 sq. kilometers (1,279 sq. miles), including rivers, streams, swamps and forest and game reserves. Approximately 78% of the land is arable farming. 83% of households rely on subsistence farming for food and grow cassava, sorghum, groundnuts, sweet potatoes and simsim. People living along the River Nile fish on a smaller scale.

THE NEED FOR LODGING

Moyo lacks lodging and Lonyi Village will create a destination that will attract and recruit other travelers and support. This will also foster collaboration and accelerate economic development.

- The Village will draw NGO support for this area that is currently deficient.
- The Village will be a voluntourism destination that has never existed here before. This will bring exposure to this needy and essentially forgotten part of the world.

THE NEED FOR TRAINING FACILITIES

There is a large demand for all types of training that is non-existent in Moyo or any other neighboring communities in the north due to lack of accommodations, facilitators, internet access, and infrastructure. Most training facilities exist in bigger cities that take days to reach and aren't affordable.

A SUSTAINABLE SOLUTION

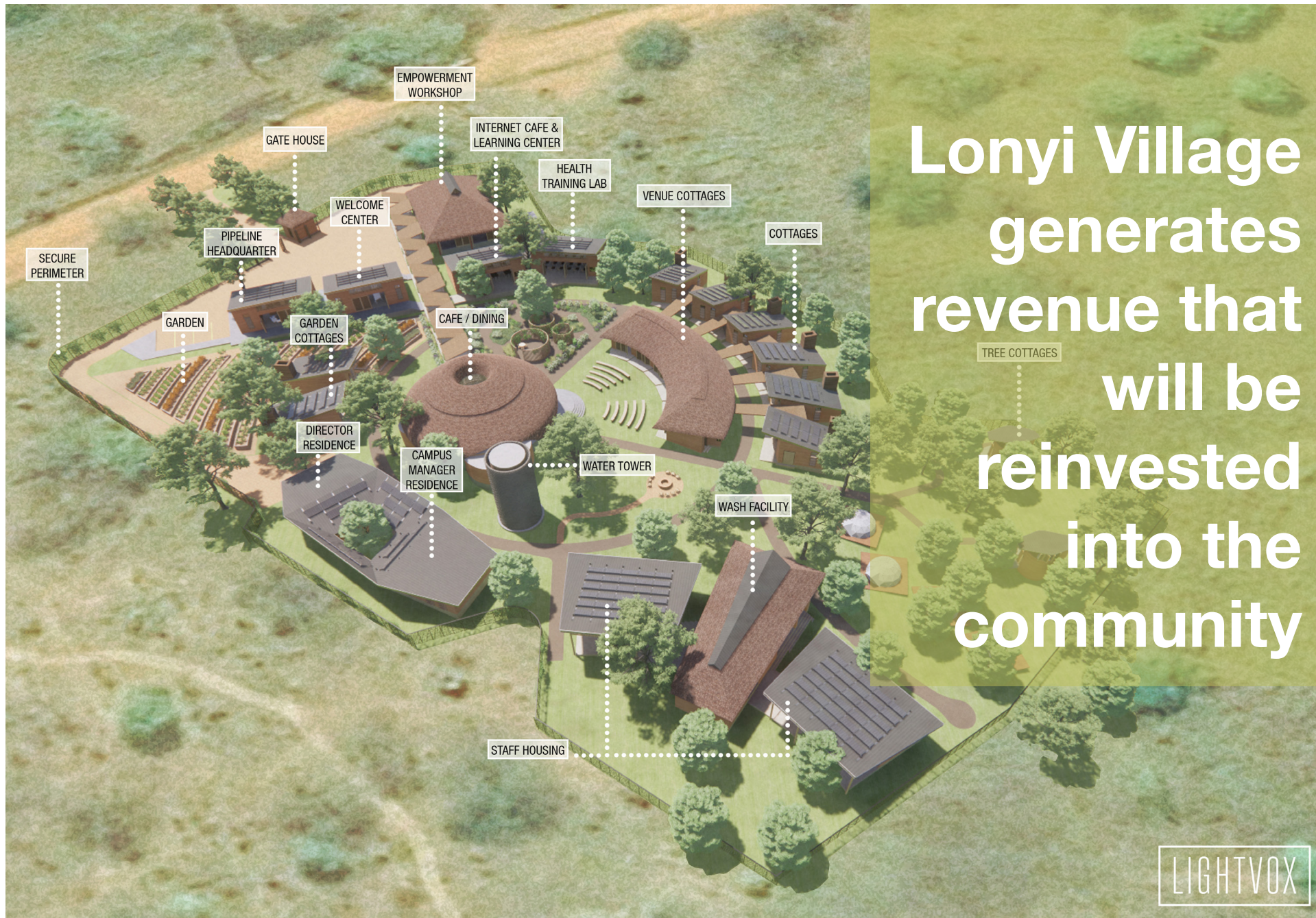
A donation to Lonyi Village will continue to directly benefit members of this community. By generating revenue and facilitating long-term employment and training, the long-term benefits will have sustaining impact that will support economic growth for generations to come.

- **Revenue Generating:** The facility won't need money for operational support and will be self-sustaining.
- **Train the Trainer Model:** We will develop talent that will change their own community through capacity building in a variety of sectors including development (construction, water, and energy), healthcare, education, and empowerment (agriculture and entrepreneurship).
- **Proven Model:** We already have the relationships and experience working in this area. We've been measuring impact and have seen positive results.
- **Immersed in the Community:** Having a presence on the ground will improve communication, continuity, and long-term growth.



This 3.5 acre humanitarian lodging and training campus will include:

1. Welcome Center - Reception & Marketplace
2. Administrative Field Office
3. Learning Center - Internet Café/Virtual Training Classroom, Health Training Classroom, and Simulation Lab
4. Indoor/Outdoor Café with Demonstration Kitchen
5. 18 Guest Cottages (6 designed for student and small group lodging)
6. Duplex for Country Director & Village Mgr.
7. Staff Housing
8. WASH Facility (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) for shared staff facilities
9. Workshop – carpentry, maintenance, and material receiving/storage.
10. Small Group Pavilions
11. Demonstration Garden
12. Sapling Nursery
13. Housekeeping

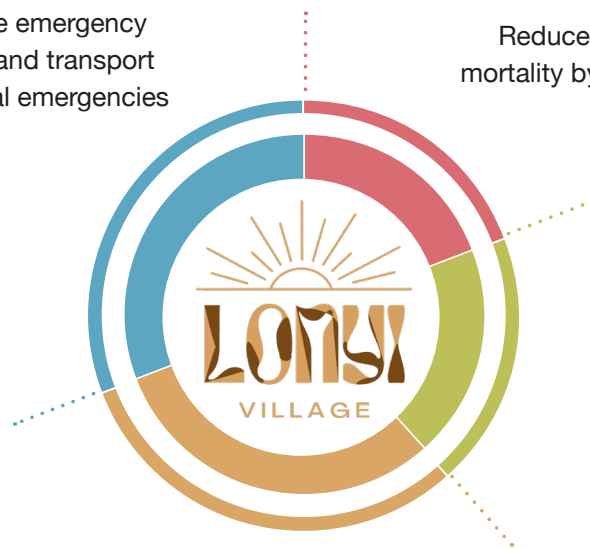

WHY NOW

BUILD THE PATH TO PROSPERITY

In just the last eighteen months, Pipeline Worldwide has provided backup power for the NICU unit at Moyo General Hospital, bought and installed two new incubators, and sponsored continued medical education for nurses and midwives.

Through these interventions, we've been able to reduce infant mortality in this region by 50%. This is just one example of how we're saving lives and without the support of generous donors, this would not be possible.

VILLAGE AMBULANCE SAVES LIVES

In June 2022, Pipeline Worldwide donated the first two village ambulances to Aya and Kweyo villages in Moyo, Uganda. Prior to this, these remote communities have lacked access to emergency transportation that would get expecting mothers and other emergency situations to nearby health centers. Many treatable conditions have resulted in unnecessary deaths.

Recently, we received reports from the Aya community that they had 3 urgent referrals in one week where the ambulances saved lives. These emergencies included a severe fracture and two expectant mothers in labor. One of the mothers was attempting to walk to the nearest health center (since she couldn't afford transportation) and went unconscious on the side of the road. The village ambulance arrived just in time to deliver the newborn. Thankfully both mother and baby survived and are doing well.

Without these village ambulances, people are left to find their own means of transportation. The only affordable option is to use a boda boda (motorcycle) which most people in the community cannot afford. Further, severe injuries and vulnerable pregnant mothers are not able to use this mode of transportation. Lives will continue to be saved, and Pipeline Worldwide is looking forward to growing our village ambulance fleet and serving other deserving communities.

MOYO HOSPITAL NICU RECEIVES TWO NEW INCUBATORS

Following the installation of an emergency power solution in July of 2022, the only working Incubator in an overcrowded NICU broke down completely in January of 2023. Pipeline crowd funded again to purchase a new one. Our generous donors once again delivered.

Not only did the NICU receive one brand new incubator, but thanks to another generous donor, we were able to purchase a second one! Both were installed on March 6, 2023 and triplets were the first beneficiaries followed by twins! According to the head NICU nurse, they recently received an award for *The Best Performing Unit in Reducing Perinatal Death*.

REALITY OF LACK OF POWER

In September of 2022, the NICU unit at Moyo General Hospital experienced a devastating four-hour power outage which ended the lives of two babies and placed premature twins, born 10 weeks early, at great risk. Because the National Grid is extremely unreliable, these power outages appear to be a normal occurrence. It's imperative that back-up solutions are readily available in cases like these. As this is not available in Moyo Hospital, Pipeline immediately raised funds for an emergency power solution which included solar and batteries.

Our generous donors helped us reach that goal within a few days and Pipeline was able to provide this solution quickly and efficiently. In turn, it helped save the lives of twins, John, and Joel, born to a severely malnourished mother with mental disabilities. Now, with the immediate back-up power solution provided by Pipeline, twins John and Joel have since left Moyo Hospital and are currently in the care of Moyo Babies Home.
