

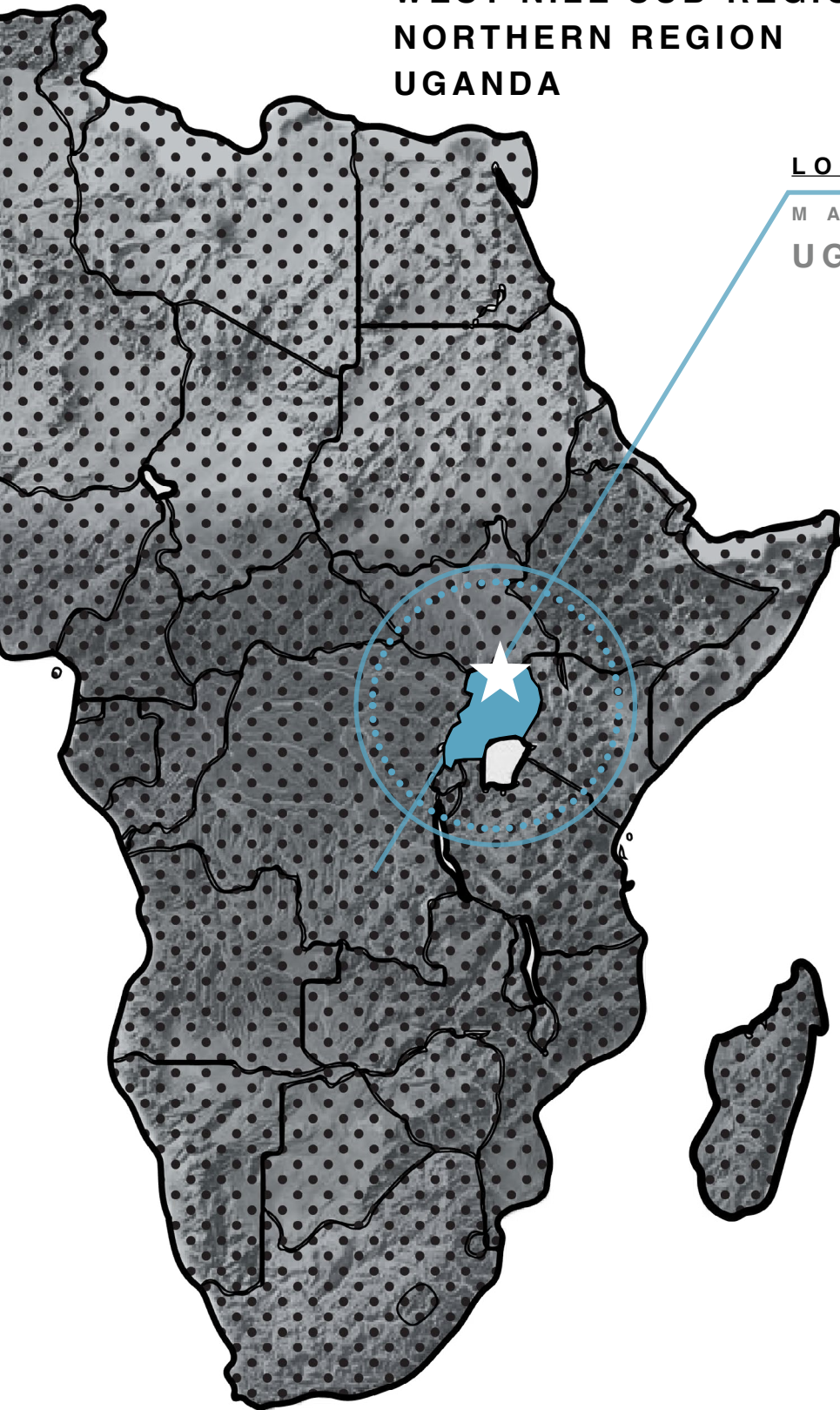

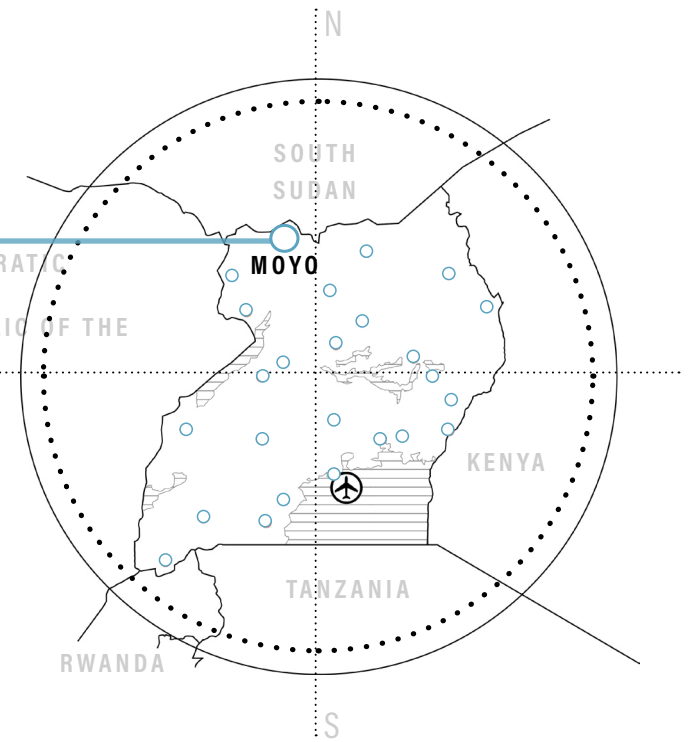
MOYO DISTRICT

WHERE IS LONYI VILLAGE DEAN RIESEN OPPORTUNITY CENTER & WHY IS THIS SIGNIFICANT?

THE PROBLEM | Moyo is a remote location in the west Nile sub-region of Uganda. It is in the northwest corner and share borders with the Democratic Republic of the Congo and South Sudan. It also hosts more than half of the 1.5 million refugees in the country. The lack of reliable power, water, paved roads and internet, combined with the highest levels of food insecurity and poverty, creates a difficult environment for improving health outcomes and economic opportunity. These conditions are particularly detrimental to the area's economy, impacting the number of available jobs, job creation and training opportunities.

- 9.5% of households have access to piped water
- 11.6% have access to electricity
- 80% of households depend on subsistence agriculture as their main economic activity

OUR SOLUTION | Pipeline Worldwide is building Lonyi Village, a 3.4 acre humanitarian lodging and training campus in Moyo, Uganda. In addition to lodging, dining, and continuing medical education, the campus will encompass the Dean Riesen Opportunity Center that will include carpentry and welding workshops, a furniture showroom, water tower, and agrivoltaics (the use of land for both agriculture and solar energy production). This center will provide essential construction trades and agriculture training, employment, and access to sustainable energy which will contribute significantly to the long-term development of the local community.
